The United Kingdom Digital Identity and Attributes Trust Framework aims to make it easier and more secure for people to use services that enable them to prove who they are or something about themselves. It is a set of rules for organisations to follow if they want to provide secure and trustworthy digital identity and/or attribute solutions.

In the context of this trust framework, a digital identity is a digital representation of a person acting as an individual or as a representative of an organisation. It enables them to prove who they are during interactions and transactions. They can use it online or in person. Services and organisations that let users use secure digital identities can better trust that those users are who they say they are.

Trust framework participants are certified against a set of UK government-approved rules. This means that one organisation can trust that the information another shares with them is accurate and reliable. To meet the rules of the trust framework, a certified provider will need to prove they are able to safely manage users' digital identities or attributes.

This document sets out what this trust framework provider has been assessed against and the types of identity profiles that the organisation is certified to provide and for which purpose(s).
